The Spokane County Public Works Department (Review Authority) has published this Notice of Application to provide the opportunity to comment on the described proposal. The comment period ends 14 calendar days from the date issued. During this period written comments may be submitted to the Review Authority. The file may be examined between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday (except holidays) at the Public Works Department offices in the Public Works Building, 1026 W. Broadway, Spokane, Washington.

**LEAD AGENCY:** Spokane County

**PROPONENT:** Spokane County

**PROJECT NAME:** Monroe St./Country Homes Blvd. Stormwater Project

**LOCATION:** Country Homes Blvd. Site: The proposed project is located on, adjacent, or near the intersections of Country Homes Blvd., Wedgewood Avenue, and Cedar Street all located in Section 25 Township 26N, Range 42E WM and Section 30, Township 26N, Range 43E WM.

Monroe St. Site: Work will occur adjacent to the east side of Monroe Street approx. 500' south of the Monroe/Wall St. intersection in Section 30, T26N, R43E WM.

**SCOPE OF WORK:** Work will include removal of an existing asphalt drainage ditch, culvert placement, creation of bioinfiltration systems, stormwater pipe will be replaced, realigned or added to and drywells will be installed throughout the project as needed.

**ZONING:** Low Density Residential

**OTHER PERMITS:** To be determined

**FURTHER STUDIES:** To be determined

**ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW:** The Public Works Department has reviewed the proposed project for probable adverse environmental impacts and expects to issue a determination of nonsignificance (DNS) for this project. **The optional DNS process in WAC 197-11-355 is being used. This may be the only opportunity to comment on the environmental impacts of the proposed project.** The proposal may include mitigation measures under applicable codes, and the project review process may incorporate or require mitigation measures regardless of whether an EIS is prepared. A copy of subsequent threshold determination for the specific proposal may be obtained upon request. Any SEPA appeal is governed by the Spokane Environmental Ordinance and such appeal shall be filed within fourteen (14) days after the notice that the determination has been made.

**EXISTING ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS:** N/A

**WRITTEN COMMENTS:** Agencies, tribes and the public are encouraged to review and provide written comments on the proposed project and its probable environmental impacts. All comments received within 14 calendar days of the date issued below will be considered prior to making a decision on this application.

**DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS:** Spokane County Zoning Code, Spokane County Subdivision Ordinance, Spokane County Standards for Roads and Sewer Construction, Spokane County Guidelines for Stormwater Management, Spokane County Critical Area Ordinance and the regulations of the Spokane Regional Health District are the primary regulations applicable to the site.

**CONSISTENCY:** In consideration of the above referenced development regulations and typical conditions and/or mitigating measures, the proposal is found to be consistent with the "type of land use", "level of development", "infrastructure", and "character of development".

**PUBLIC HEARING:** This action is not subject to a future public hearing.
