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**DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE (DNS)**  
WAC 197-11 & Spokane County Code Chapter 11

**PROPOSAL:** Mead Mt. Spokane Pump Station and Pipelines Project, Phase 1 & 2

**DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL:** Phase 1 & 2 will construct facilities (i.e. pump station, inverted siphon, and pipelines) required to convey wastewater from the Mead Mt. Spokane area to Spokane County's existing sewer system in Little Spokane Drive.

The project includes constructing a gravity sewer pipeline from the Hunter's Pointe residential development to a siphon structure and associated access road and site area to be located on the hillside west of Hunter's Pointe. Siphon structure and associated valve vault will require controls for operation and power will need to be provided onsite. Dual ductile iron force mains will extend west from the siphon structure, under Little Deep Creek with a trenchless undercrossing, through an easement into Little Spokane Drive, hang on the Little Spokane River Bridge and connect into a gravity sewer manhole at the intersection of Little Spokane Drive and Lantern Lane. Restoration of Little Spokane Drive and other related work is required.

In addition, sewer pipeline will be installed east of the Meadow View development in Moody Rd., Freya St. and Day Mt. Spokane Road to Highway 2. A pump station will be constructed adjacent to Mt. Spokane Park Drive for future conveyance north along US Highway 2.

The appeal must be submitted in writing, by 5:00 PM, May 18, 2018, and contain the specific factual objections.
