



Sample Ballot

Instructions
Marking Your Ballot



Completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice. Use a dark pen.

Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for a ballot measure will be an over vote and no votes for that ballot measure will be counted.



If you make a correction, draw a line through the entire response. You then have the option of making another choice if you wish.

In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day (April 22). A list of deposit sites may be found at www.spokanecounty.org/elections.

Establishment of Spokane Valley Library Capital Facility Area

The Board of County Commissioners of Spokane County, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 13-1130, concerning the establishment of a Library Capital Facility Area to be known as the Spokane Valley Library Capital Facility Area, the boundaries of which are described in Resolution No. 13-1130. This proposition, if approved, would establish the Spokane Valley Library Capital Facility Area within the boundaries of the City of Spokane Valley and the City of Millwood consistent with Chapter 27.15 RCW.

Spokane Valley Library Capital Facility Area
General Obligation Bonds \$22,000,000

The Board of County Commissioners of Spokane County, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 13-1131, concerning a proposition to finance new and expanded libraries. This proposition would authorize the construction of a replacement Spokane Valley Library, new Veradale/Greenacres Library and Argonne Library expansion; issue general obligation bonds maturing over 20 years in the amount of \$22,000,000; and levy annual excess property taxes to pay such bonds, as provided in Resolution No. 13-1131.

Proposition No. 1
Reardan-Edwall School District No. 9
Bonds to Renovate School Facilities

The Board of Directors of Reardan-Edwall School District No. 9 adopted Resolution No. 06-2013/14 concerning a proposition to renovate school facilities. This proposition would authorize the District to renovate Reardan Elementary School (including constructing classrooms, computer and science rooms, kitchen/multipurpose addition and new roof; and upgrading electrical and HVAC systems), renovate Smith Gym (including upgrading plumbing, electrical and HVAC systems and making ADA improvements), and reconfigure bus loading zones; issue no more than \$8,405,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 30 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, as provided in Resolution No. 06-2013/14.

Proposition No. 1
Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 13
(Newman Lake Fire & Rescue)
Bonds to Construct a New Fire Station

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 13 adopted Resolution No. 2014-2 concerning a proposition to construct a new fire station. This proposition would authorize the District to construct and equip a new fire station and purchase firefighting and lifesaving equipment; issue no more than \$1,100,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2014-2.
