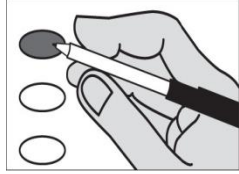
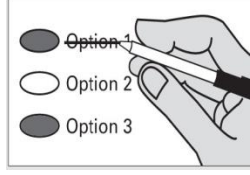


Instructions

Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for contest will be an overvote and no votes for that ballot contest will be counted. Vote for one candidate per office. To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, write the name on the line provided and fill in the oval.

Correcting Your Ballot



If you make a correction or mismark your ballot, draw a line through the entire response. You then have the option of making another choice if you wish. In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 P.M. on Election Day (November 3, 2015).

The Board of Directors of Liberty School District No. 362 adopted Resolution No. 14-15/08, concerning a proposition to improve student safety, infrastructure and educational opportunities. This proposition would authorize the District to: make District-wide student safety and security improvements, renovate the 1960 portion of Liberty High School, construct an additional gymnasium and commons area at Liberty High School, and renovate Liberty Elementary/Junior High School; issue no more than \$12,900,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 14-15/08.
