Project Name: Spokane County Lincoln Rd Street Improvements and Sewer Main

Description of proposal: Spokane County Public Works is proposing to reconstruct a portion of Lincoln Rd and install sanitary sewer mains and side sewer connections. Work will also include new curbs, swales and a 10' shared use path.

Location of proposal: The project begins at the Spokane City Limits (intersection of Lincoln Rd and Crestline St) and continues 3500' east to the intersection of Lincoln Rd and Market St. Sections 21 and 28 T26N R43E (Spokane County, WA).

SEPA Environmental Review: Spokane County has reviewed the proposed project for probable adverse environmental impacts and expects to issue a Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS). This determination is based on the following findings and conclusions:
