

Spokane County Auditor's Office Seeking Volunteers for Drafting of Ballot Measure Positions for Special Election

SPOKANE COUNTY, February 28, 2023 — The Spokane County Auditor's Office – Elections Division is seeking volunteers to write arguments on the following ballot measures appearing on the April 25, 2023 Special Election ballot to be printed in the Local Voters Pamphlet:

- Orchard Prairie School District Statements *For* and *Against* the Proposition of a Replacement Educational Programs and Operation Levy

According to [Revised Code of Washington 29A.32.280](#), districts proposing the measures are responsible for appointing committees to write arguments for and against each measure. The districts have not appointed all committees to write arguments on the measures, so the County Auditor is seeking individuals to serve on those committees.

The Special Election Local Voters' Pamphlet includes official ballot titles, explanatory statements, arguments "for" and "against" each measure, and rebuttals.

Committee members are required to be residents of the district in order to draft arguments and at least one person must be willing to be named in the voters' pamphlet as a member of the committee.
